No appointment needed. You will be assisted on a first come, first serve basis.

Required documents to bring with you are listed on the back.

DID YOU BRING?

- Photo ID
- Social Security cards for you, your spouse and children
- An Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) assignment letters, for ALL family members
- Birth dates for you, your spouse and dependents listed on the tax return
- W-2 forms for **ALL** jobs worked in 2018
- Form 1099-G for unemployment compensation
- Form W-2G, SSA 1099 and other 1099 forms for other income in 2018
- Pension or annuity forms 1099-R and date pension started
- Brokerage statements and Form 1099-B for sale of stock or other property
- Child care provider name, address, and tax ID numbers, and amount paid in 2018
- Copy of last year's state and federal tax returns
- Self-employment information, including income and expenses
- Other applicable tax-related documents, such as: interest and dividends statements, student loan documents, property taxes, mortgage interest, list of organizations to which you made charitable donations, tuition statements and expenses, medical payments YOU made, withdrawals from IRAs and/or 401k, etc.
- Forms 1095-A, B or C, Affordable Health Care Statements or health insurance exemption certificates
- Bank or credit union account and routing number
- Voided check or savings deposit slip
