Economic Resilience

Fine Free

The Library returned to its roots as a Fine Free library system. Over 9,000 lost items valued at nearly \$200,000 were returned in the first year. 2,805 patrons whose cards had been blocked by overdue fines have renewed their cards and checked out over 100,000 items.





Career Online High School Graduation

This enduring program continues to transform lives through the awarding of Florida-accredited high school diplomas to adults who have completed all the necessary coursework to graduate and begin the next chapter of their lives. Twenty scholarships to the Career Online High School program were granted and eight students have successfully persevered and achieved

their goals this year, celebrating with a Library graduation party. Through life challenges such as domestic violence, pregnancy at a young age, and language barriers, these students now have the tools they need to realize their full personal and professional potential.

Volunteer Fairs

The Library creates connections between people wanting to share their time and energy and deserving organizations that fill important needs and provide vital assistance for living and thriving. The West Osceola Library provided 156 people with opportunities through organizations such as the AARP, Adult Literacy League and Give Kids the World Village.



Virtual Innovation

Princh for mobile printing

The switch to Princh has provided a much faster, reliable way for patrons to send documents to print over the wireless network. Using their tablets, phones, or laptops, patrons can retrieve their documents from public printers in seconds with this system upgrade.



MessageBee for texts and phone calls

When the phone is our most important communication tool, it's essential the Library has a reliable and easy-to-use system of sending texts and phone notices for holds and renewals. With MessageBee, patrons can be sure to get their notices on time, control the notice language, and opt out of any notifications,



and Library staff gain a user-friendly and consistent way to reach our patrons.

Robotics & Memory Lab launches

TechCentral has expanded with two new areas. The Robotics Lab is a school-age collaborative workspace for instructor-led classes and open lab hours featuring LEGO Mindstorm, Arduino, VEX robots and more. The Memory Lab, funded in part by the Osceola Friends of the Library, features a do-it-yourself suite of preservation technology designed to help capture and convert old photos, home videos, audio recordings and more for generations to come.





Community Visibility

Ready To Learn partnership with WUCF

The Library played a key role in WUCF's initiative to expand PBS KIDS' early learning resources to Central Florida communities. As part of the CPB-PBS Ready To Learn program, the Library helped create "Learning Neighborhood" programs that foster a culture of learning at home, in neighborhoods, and local spaces. The collaboration focused mostly on the Hart Memorial Library and brought highly visible workshops, events, and educational programs to local families, supporting early literacy, critical thinking, and school readiness and featuring favorite PBS characters. This ongoing partnership continues to



break down barriers to caregiver participation, promoting intergenerational learning and ensuring that Library resources reach even more families across the region.

Celebrating the Eclipse

By April 8, the day of the solar eclipse, the Library had distributed over 700 eclipse glasses which accounted for most of the nearly 5,500 phone calls received in April! The Library hosted two events: Eclipse 101 at the St. Cloud Library, featuring a presenter from the Central Florida Astronomical Society, and the Here Comes the Sun: Eclipse Viewing Party at the West Osceola Library. WESH-2 news visited the party, interviewing kids and parents as they created an eclipse viewer and discussed how important it is that libraries teach about science and current events.





Cultural Connector

Celebrating Eid a-Fitr!

The West Osceola Library's Eid program, celebrating the end of Ramadan, was a big success with 51 attendees. More importantly, it sparked excitement for future events that celebrate Muslim culture. Patrons expressed appreciation for the representation, cultural education and sense of community, with many noting they'd never seen such programming before. Activities like henna art, a storytime, and traditional treats were well-received, and families valued the chance for their children to create connections with their Muslim culture and other families in the community.



Crochet, Sewing & Crafty Crew

The Library is getting everyone in the crocheting zone! With regular classes like BVL Library's Off the Hook introducing kids and teens to the joys of crochet with fun projects like plushies and jewelry, and Crochet 101 at the West Osceola Library where adults can make beautiful patterns and friends, the Library encourages connections, skill-building and meaningful hobbies while learning in a safe, supportive environment. Sewing classes at the BVL Library and in TechCentral teach adults basic techniques that turn into fun projects but also create the foundation for potential employment opportunities. Crafty Crew brings people together to learn and share over crafting, helping to curb isolation and create community bonds.

Collection Highlights

A variety of materials were added to the collection to offer patrons fun and interesting ways to increase learning opportunities and expand Library use.

Wonderbooks:

A new starter collection was created with a print book/pre-loaded audiobook player combo perfect for beginning readers, with new titles arriving quarterly.

- Blood Pressure Kits: Through a grant from the American Heart Association, this circulating collection of self-monitoring blood pressure kits is available at all libraries.
- Foreign Language Collection in cloudLibrary: Titles in French, Creole and Spanish have been added to cloudLibrary with plans for more titles in other languages.

FINRA collections:

Books about investing, financial planning and budgeting were added to the collection as part of a grant to support communities affected by natural disaster.

hoopla discoverable in the catalog:
 To make finding the vast hoopla collection easier to find and access, records for items can be searched and discovered in the card catalog with a link out to hoopla for access.

Osceola Regional Behavioral Health as institutional partner:

This became a new stop on our courier route for Assisted Living Facilities to help connect more people to important library resources.

Adding to Launchpad collection:

A dedicated budget was implemented for increasing this popular collection with quarterly additions.
